The project is a private/public partnership. Over 1200 families have been enrolled in the project to date.

Responsibilities include:

- Coordinating with our Research team to document outcomes for participants in all sponsored projects and reporting to funders
- Maintaining fiscal sustainability of the Linda Ray Intervention Center programs which is 95% supported by extramural funding. To this end, activities include identification of potential federal, state, local and private sources of funding, writing competitive grants and negotiating contracts and managing budgets to maintain the programs and staff of 40 on an annual basis. Annual budget exceeds \$1 million dollars.
- Providing oversight and monitoring of daily operations management of the program activities funded from multiple sources, including: the Miami-Dade County Public Schools, The Children's Trust, the Florida Department of Education (FDLRS,) Florida Department of Health (childcare food program,) U.S. Bureau of Justice
